For the conference we are soliciting papers that demonstrate potential to be published in the new journal, if the authors choose this option. The conference is also a great networking opportunity, especially during coffee and lunch breaks as well as during the Portuguese welcome dinner.

We are accepting and reviewing work on a rolling basis until February 18, 2015. Authors are strongly encouraged to submit their abstract as soon as possible to allow for sufficient time to settle any questions that the expert panel might have and to provide a comfortable time window for funding and possible travel visa applications.

The abstract should not exceed 300 words. Proposals may cover any topic related to economic history and business history. If you have doubts about whether your proposal fits, please contact us for assistance.
